Twenty-one graduate from Archbishop Bergan 100% of graduates plan to attend college in the fall

Archbishop Bergan Catholic School held its graduation ceremony on Saturday, May 15, 2010. The ceremony was held at St. Patrick's Catholic Church with Fr. James deAnda officiating.

Father deAnda is associate pastor, youth and hispanic minister for St. Patrick's Parish and chaplain for Archbishop Bergan Catholic School.

Courtney Cook was valedictorian. Jordan Ruskamp, was salutatorian.

One hundred percent of the class has accepted and will attend college this fall: 71% plan on four-year public colleges, 10% plan on four-year private colleges, 19% plan on two-year community colleges.

Scholarships offered to the graduating class of 2010 include \$239,150 in academic scholarships; \$242,900 in athletic scholarships; Total scholarships offered \$482,050.

More important than what is offered is what the graduates accepted, which includes the following (as of May 13, 2010): \$168,950 academic accepted; \$138,900 athletic accepted; for a total of \$307,850 of accepted scholarships.

"I want to thank the Parish of St. Patrick, parish staff, Archbishop Bergan administration and staff, parents and guardians, grandparents and all others who have contributed to the growth of these fine stu-

dents," said Neil Feser, guidance director.

Still time to register for Bergan, tuition changes made for fall

The School Board and administration of Archbishop Bergan Catholic School has decided to adjust the amount of the tuition increase for the 2010-2011 school year.

For over 50 years, Archbishop Bergan Catholic School has been a committed provider of a private parochial, quality education within the Fremont community. It is through this commitment to our community that we recognize the financial difficulties facing many in these uncertain times. As part of our continuing mission to educate as many students as possible, regardless of socio-economic status, tuition and fees were re-evaluated.

Tuition rates for the 2010-2011 academic year will be: Kindergarten-5th grade parishioner \$2,000; Kindergarten – 5th grade non-parishioner \$2,300; 6th grade parishioner \$2,600; 6th grade non-parishioner \$2,900; 7th-8th grade parishioner \$3,000; 7th-8th grade non-parishioner \$3,400; 9th-12th grade parishioner \$3,800; Family maximum parishioner \$7,250; family maximum non-parishioner \$8,750.

A down payment of \$100 is required at registration for each student enrolling at Archbishop Bergan Catholic School for the first time.

Cost to educate a child attending Bergan is \$6,466 this year.

Parishioners - When making your Sunday donation, please be mindful of the difference between the costs to educate your child/children and the amount you are being asked to pay in tuition.
