News from the Alumni Office



We celebrated another successful Catholic Schools Week, thanks to the efforts of many and now are working hard on recruitment of students for next year. Numbers are looking good. Of course,

students are our life blood and an increase in enrollment is always great news.

Also encouraging, we finished the last fiscal year with a balanced budget and are currently balanced for the current fiscal year. You should have received a letter regarding the Bergan Annual Appeal. As a reminder, please consider a gift and increasing it from last year. We are very thankful to you who continue to support Archbishop Bergan Catholic School financially. Thank you!

Our Bergan students continue to excel in a variety of areas. Recently, a group of students won first place in the Math and Engineering contest at Wayne State College, the dance team won the Hip Hop dance event in state competition, the wrestling team completed a successful season, winning the Bergan Invitational. They qualified five for state with two receiving medals. Three Bergan students who participate in the cooperative swimming program with Fremont Public School qualified for state with one winning a medal. The boys' basketball team, which does not have a senior on the squad, recently won the district and earned a trip to the state tournament, the results are not known as of this writing. The music and drama teams are working hard for their upcoming contests. I know the risk of naming a few accomplishments and leaving some out so I apologize if I have done so.

I would like to remind you to make "Athletic Hall of Fame" inductee nominations for this year. The deadline is May 1st. Nomination forms can be found in this newsletter on page five and six, on the Bergan web site or at the Parish and school offices.

Since I began my job at Archbishop Bergan Catholic School six months ago, I have learned so much about this wonderful school and am increasingly excited about the opportunities that this

school offers its students, families, and our community.

There are great things happening at Archbishop Bergan Catholic School and I would like to share some of them with you. Our mission is centered on faith, knowledge, and service. Our average ACT for the Class of 2012 was 24.2 which is 2 points above the Nebraska state average of 22.1. This year one of our seniors scored the maximum of 36 on the test. Our graduates complete on average a total of 15 college credits prior to graduation. We have a 100% graduation rate for the last 10 years. Our graduates have received an average of over \$14,000 in scholarship dollars for their first year of college for the past 10 years. We have a student to teacher ratio of 12:1.

News from the Advancement Office

For a number of years, the Bergan Alumni office held a Phon-A-Thon in the spring to contact St. Patrick/Bergan Alumni and ask for their financial support. Two years ago, due to the lack of volunteers and the low participation rate of the alumni, the decision was made to discontinue the Phon-A-Thon. In its place, there was an appeal last year that included Bergan alumni, current parents, and benefactors. Beginning this year, this effort to raise funds for the operation of our school will be called the Bergan Annual Appeal.

Please note the purpose of this Appeal is to raise funds for our operating budget. While we do have students who receive limited tuition assistance, this money comes from the endowments that are established specifically for tuition assistance and the Children's Scholarship Fund (a national program) and the Archdiocese of Omaha. We do not have any money in our operating budget for tuition assistance.

As we stated in earlier communications, tuition only covers a portion of the expenses that are incurred in the operation of our school. Over half of the funds that we need are given by St. Patrick's Parish, with the remaining funds coming from endowment income and other fund raising efforts, such as the Knight Event and the Bergan Annual Appeal. Thank you for helping us build Bergan into a stronger community of faith, and for your generous support in the past.

Thank you, Mrs. Wewell for 25 years of service



I was born and raised on a ranch in North Platte, Nebraska. I went to a catholic school all my life and my strong faith background carried me through all the chapters in my life.

Upon graduating from University of Nebraska, Lincoln, my first teaching and coaching assignment was at Bergan. Mr. Gary Schmidt, then principal, assigned me head basketball coach, head volleyball coach, head drill team coach, assistant track coach, along with teaching science, physical education and health classes. While at Bergan, I met mv husband of 33 years, Joe Wewel. After a brief stint in Fort Calhoun teaching and coaching, we moved back to Fremont after Lou, Pat, and Tom Wewel passed away. In 1983, I took the head volleyball coaching position which included recruiting at Midland College (now Midland University) and stayed for eight years. I took a position for a year at

Fremont high school coaching volleyball and swimming. Mr. Gary Schmidt hired me back to Archbishop Bergan where I have coached and taught middle school science, physical education and biology the last 20 years (thanks Mr. Schmidt!) During that time I received my masters degree from Creighton University in school counseling and then received a middle school endorsement from University of Nebraska, Omaha all within the last ten years.

I was very blessed to have wonderful athletes who wanted to give their all to the volleyball program. As I reflect back, I am so grateful to all the parents and families who helped our volleyball program reach new heights in the late 90's and beyond. The volleyball teams put together 14 straight 20 win seasons and five of seven years competing in the state tournament. At the end of coaching, 2009, I was fortunate enough to be named a *Nebraska Volleyball All Star Coach* in which capped off a very gratifying coaching career. Bergan students excel. Whether it be in the classroom or in any other areas, we as coaches and educators hold our kids to high standards and a commitment to excellence. These young men and women that we teach within our school every day are committed to being the best. That is evident when I talk to alumni and see all the successful lives they live and that is why I believe Archbishop Bergan is a great place to be.

Bottom line, at the end of the day, it all comes down to those people who support you and stand by you to stay coaching and teaching so many years. My husband Joe, daughters Shalan (husband Beau, granddaughter Adeline), Jillian (husband JD) and Halie, along with my sister-in-law Kate Hurst (my assistant volleyball coach for 13 years) and so many volleyball parents helped to shape my career as a teacher and coach. Thank you to all of them.

Thank you, Mr. Feser for 35 years of service



My father grew up in the Great Depression and could not afford to go to college. He was a farmer but should have been an investment banker. He did not make any money

farming, but did well with his investments. My mother was a teacher. Many in her family were. I never understood how my parentscame together. They were nothing alike but complimented each other very well. I have a brother who likes to travel. He works for a company that distributes millions of phone books in the big cities in the western half of the country. He moves around and supervises the operations. I have a sister who is a nurse and another sister who oversees the legal/technical details of all billings at a Veterans Hospital in Indiana.

I earned a Bachelor's Degree in Speech from Creighton University and a Master's Degree in Guidance from Creighton. I have done Post Graduate work at several universities. I student taught at Tech High School and Cathedral High School in Omaha. I was offered a job as Counselor and Drama Teacher at Cathedral the next year and enjoyed the experience. In my 5th year I was told that a nun who had been a former counselor there offered to come back. Because she could work for much less money, they felt bad, but had to let me go. Gary Schmidt, principal of Archbishop Bergan during those years, heard about it, called me because Bergan was in need of a counselor and the rest is history. I think God had a plan.

Who influenced me to become a teacher/ counselor? God. I didn't have a choice in the matter. It is who I am. It was a predominant theme in our family, especially from my mother who was a teacher. It was fostered by the teachers I had in high school, especially Gordon Sunner my English teacher who was a great story teller and exceptional professional whom I was lucky to have in most of my years at Harlan Community High School.

I love to write. I have been published or paid for material in many genres: journal articles, magazine articles, media, scripts, comedy material, and two books: *Challenging College* which helped students discover how to approach college admissions. After I developed a writing relationship with Tom Smothers who was at the top of TV world at the time, I expanded on a character he had called the Yo-Yo Man and wrote a whimsical book on the philosophy of doing yo-yo tricks, called *The Book of Yo.* It used the yo-yo as a metaphor. Just like a person cannot yank a yo-yo around in the air as it flows through a trick, we should not yank ourselves or others around as we live in the flow of life.

My Mission in life is simple: Improve the Flow of Success. At Bergan I am able to incorporate core beliefs in God with world-wide opportunities. The combination needs to be lit within the hearts of young people. I have been doing this a long time, but my best years are still before me as I continue to eliminate blockages in young lives and open doors that help them flow into their futures without the blockages that have held so many of us back. I want the young to become fast studies, God centered learners, and great in their many and varied fields. I want to improve their flow of success, which will then improve the flow of their children and on and on.
