

The students at Archbishop Bergan Catholic School are the greatest example of our public image. Our students do a great job outside of our school representing the Bergan Family with honor, respect and school pride. We are very proud of our students and the way that they conduct themselves as disciples of Christ.

When Archbishop Bergan Catholic School students attend a school activity the expectation is that they wear clothing that is modest in nature. School dances, home and away activities contests, service work, volunteer opportunities, etc. are all examples of events that require proper student dress.

The definition of modesty is "behavior, manner, or appearance intended to avoid impropriety or indecency." Male and female students should be choosing wearing attire that is modest in appearance. While there are clothing styles that are currently considered "fashionable" by our popular culture, they would not be considered modest or appropriate attire for a student as a representative of Saint Patrick Parish or Archbishop Bergan Catholic School.

This message is serving as a reminder to make sure that your clothing is modest, and does not distract from the privilege of being a student that is representing Saint Patrick Parish or Archbishop Bergan Catholic School. We expect our students to adhere to modest dress attire in any aspect of their involvement with Archbishop Bergan Catholic School.

Examples of inappropriate dress include but are not limited to...

Tank tops, sleeveless shirts, mid-drift shirts, tights, yoga pants, leggings, see through clothing, clothing with holes, clothing that is not appropriate length, non-fingertip length shorts, low cut shirts, clothing with inappropriate designs, advertising or wording, any revealing attire, etc.

As a Catholic School community, we expect our students to make appropriate choices. Parents, we ask for your assistance in helping your student make appropriate dress code choices as well. Please know that we as a school staff will hold your student accountable for not making appropriate choices as outlined above or in your Family Handbook on pages 21, 22, 23 and 24.
